

Notification of Admission

Admission is granted to students who meet the minimum requirements for admission to the University of Northern Iowa. Candidates who are accepted for admission to the University of Northern Iowa will receive a letter of admission from the Office of Admissions and Registration. The letter of admission will contain the following information:

Certificate in Criminology and Criminal Justice Application Procedures

1. The application fee is \$55.00 (\$40.00 for students who are currently enrolled in a program at the University of Northern Iowa).
2. The application fee is non-refundable.
3. The application fee is due at the time of application.
4. The application fee is due by the deadline for application.
5. The application fee is due to the Office of Admissions and Registration.

Note: Candidates who are applying for admission to a certificate program under the University's Adult Learner policy should also submit a letter of application describing educational background, work experience, and academic plans. Course Numbers

Each course number consists of a four-digit course number, a letter designating the section, and a letter designating the term. For example, 1000-A-1000 is the first section of the first course offered in the first term.

1. First Digit

The first digit of the course number indicates the level of the course. The following table shows the course levels for each digit:

0000-	Elementary
1000-	First-year
2000-	Second-year
3000-	Third-year
4000-	Fourth-year
5000-	Graduate

2. Second/Third Digit

The second and third digits of the course number indicate the course's placement within the level. For example, 1000-D-1000 is the fourth section of the first course offered in the first term.

3. Fourth Digit

The fourth digit of the course number indicates the course's placement within the section. For example, 1000-A-1000 is the first section of the first course offered in the first term. The following table shows the course levels for each digit:

0	First section
1	Second section
2	Third section
3	Fourth section
4	Fifth section
5	Sixth section
6	Seventh section
7	Eighth section
8	Ninth section
9	Tenth section

Course Sections

A course section is a group of students who are enrolled in a course at the same time and place. Each section is identified by a letter designating the section. For example, 1000-A-1000 is the first section of the first course offered in the first term.

Withdrawal from Course (academic year)

Students who wish to withdraw from a course must do so before the withdrawal deadline. The withdrawal deadline is the last day of the semester. Students who withdraw from a course after the withdrawal deadline will receive a grade of "W" on their transcript. Students who withdraw from a course before the withdrawal deadline will receive a grade of "W" on their transcript. Students who withdraw from a course after the withdrawal deadline will receive a grade of "W" on their transcript.

Repeating Courses

Students who fail a course may be allowed to repeat the course. The number of times a student may repeat a course is limited. Students who repeat a course will receive a grade of "R" on their transcript. Students who repeat a course will receive a grade of "R" on their transcript.

Policy on UNB Courses
